HOMEWORK



Homework will continue to be handed out on Friday, with a hand in date of Wednesday. This will consist of one piece of maths, one piece of English and reading. The maths the children will be given will be a repeat or recap of work they have done in class and closely follows the scheme of work we use in school. The English will either be a piece of spelling, punctuation and grammar work, or a piece of reading comprehension. Reading is expected to be done every day and at least once over the weekend.

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SNACKS AND DRINKS

Children can bring a snack for break time, please make sure it is a healthy one. Please remember that we are a nut free school. Children will also need a named water bottle to keep in class. We please ask that only water is in the drinks bottle. However, you are more than welcome to add a slice of fruit to give it flavor.



MATHS

In Maths, Year 3 children will be developing their understanding of multiplication and division, exploring length and perimeter, learning about fractions, and measuring mass and capacity. Year 4 will continue to build on these skills, with a particular focus on multiplication and division, length and perimeter, fractions, and decimals. Lessons will include problem-solving activities to encourage reasoning and real-life application of their maths knowledge.

SCIENCE This Our Science topic this term is *Living Things and Their Habitats*. Children will explore the diversity of life on Earth, learn how animals and plants adapt to their environments, and understand how habitats are interconnected. This will include practical activities such as observing local wildlife and exploring classification

LITERACY



This term, our literacy lessons will be inspired by *Into the Forest* by Anthony Browne and *Jelly Boots, Smelly Boots* by Michael Rosen. Using these texts, children will explore creative writing in a variety of forms, including poetry, advice notes, and diary entries. They will learn to express their ideas clearly, experiment with language, and develop their own imaginative stories. Reading comprehension will continue to be an important focus, with weekly sessions on Fridays to build understanding, inference skills, and enjoyment of texts.

Geography

In Geography, children will be learning about the Amazon Rainforest and rainforests across the globe. They will investigate the plants, animals, and people that inhabit these unique ecosystems, as well as the importance of rainforest conservation. In Art, the focus will be on insects, encouraging children to study patterns, shapes, and colours in the natural world. They will experiment with different artistic techniques to create detailed and imaginative representations of insects.
