

## Music development plan summary: Cadmore End CofE Combined School and Nursery

This summary explains how Cadmore End School delivers music education to all pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision, and musical experiences – and our future plans. This information will help pupils and parents/carers understand what the school offers and which external organisations support our music provision.

### Part A: Curriculum music

At Cadmore End School, all pupils receive high-quality music education as part of the school curriculum. We provide at least one hour of timetabled curriculum music per week across Key Stage 1 and 2. We use the scheme Music Express to deliver the national curriculum objectives in music.

During lesson time, pupils have opportunities to learn to sing and play a range of instruments through whole-class ensemble teaching. Our music curriculum ensures that all pupils, including those with special educational needs (SEND), are supported in accessing music education.

## Part B: Co-curricular music

In addition to curriculum music, Cadmore End School offers a variety of co-curricular music opportunities. Pupils can participate in one-to-one and small-group tuition for instruments such as the piano, guitar, and violin, delivered by visiting music tutors. This tuition is available to pupils in Years 2 to 6, with remissions or subsidies available for families eligible for Pupil Premium.

We have a newly established school choir open to all year groups. Rehearsals take place during the school day.

## Part C: Musical experiences

Cadmore End School is committed to offering a rich variety of musical experiences to enhance pupils' learning. We hold regular singing assemblies, and pupils have opportunities to participate in school performances and events within the community. These events involve pupils across all year groups, either as performers or as members of the audience.

## In the future

Looking ahead, Cadmore End School plans to further enhance our music provision by:

- Encouraging more children to take up an instrument.
- To work closely with Buckinghamshire Music Education Hub to introduce new initiatives that support musical progression for all pupils, including those with SEND.
