News From The Classrooms

Class 1 News

We are having a fantastic term in Class 1 learning all about space! We have learnt lots of 'Wow' words including 'solar system', 'gravity', and 'launch'. We have made rockets out of cardboard tubes; experimented with colour mixing to represent the different colours of the sky throughout the day; made moon dough by mixing oil and cornflour; explored how to make shadows using torches; and have made different planets by collaging on paper plates. We have also enjoyed role playing astronauts and pretending to move with no gravity! In our PE lessons we have been working on ball skills and learning about how to move a ball around a set of cones using our feet.







In maths, Reception have been learning about the composition of 5 using part-part-whole models. We have also been looking at 4 sided shapes and making shape pictures out of these. In nursery we have been learning about height, using the vocabulary 'taller' and 'shorter'. We have also been combining two groups of objects to see how many there are all together.

We have enjoyed welcoming some new faces to Nursery this term and are so proud at how well the children have settled in. New friendships are blossoming and everyone is learning to share and take turns fairly. EYFS Team


We have talked about the importance of friends and what a good friend is like.

In maths we have been looking at division and multiplication. The year 4s have been looking at formal written methods for multiplication and both years have been using practical equipment and their timetables to solve division problems.







News from Class 4

English

We are now fully immersed in our story 'Curiosity – The Story Of The Mars Rover'. We have explored the

mysteries around the 'Red Planet' and why a robot was needed for exploration. The children have written a job advert for a scientist at NASA and are currently creating an explanation text on a planet of their choice. They have also created this fantastic 'Mars collage' in art for our wall display!





In maths, year 6 we have been having fun and games with 'Algebra'. I have to say how impressed I have been with the children's attitude to their learning and their determination to succeed in a topic that requires a slightly different way of thinking sometimes!

Year 5 have been concentrating on longer multiplication and in recent days short division – their fluency in times tables has been tested to the full but they are working with a lot more confidence!



In science the children have been learning about symbols and circuits in our electricity topic. They have been asking some really good questions and enjoyed investigating voltage in batteries and the effect increasing a voltage will have on various components.





In art, with Mrs Caine, the children have really enjoyed sculpting with clay. As you can see below, we have some some very talented sculptors in class 4!

Finally, it has been really good to see the children settling down and enjoying their reading books during those (rare!) moments when there is a little free time between lessons or when then children have completed their class activities.
