This term, Class 3 has been busy exploring a variety of topics across different subjects. In Science, we've been learning about Animals, including Humans, studying how animals and humans grow, develop, and function.

In History, we've delved into the fascinating world of the Anglo-Saxons, discovering their culture, society, and way of life. In Religious Education (RE), we've focused on the significance of Easter, exploring its religious meaning and traditions.

Additionally, in English, we've been working on newspaper reports based on our class book *The Last Polar Bears* by Harry Horse, which has been both enjoyable and informative as we explore how to report on key events from the story.



News from Class 4

It's been another very busy term in Class 4 and the children have all been working really hard and continue to make some good progress in all areas of the curriculum.

In English we are just finishing our study of 'The Lady of Shalott'. The poem has definitely been challenging at times for the children as they were obviously unfamiliar with lots of the old language used but they have persevered and can be very proud of their writing - from diary entries and newspaper reports to even writing their own illustrated verse in the style of the original!

In maths, we've moved away from number for the time being and have been having fun with area, perimeter and statistics.

All the children have worked with great enthusiasm and focus in lessons and our drive on fluency in times tables is definitely starting to show. In ICT, the children have been working with Excel spreadsheets and are now able to edit, write formulae, create graphs and insert columns and rows – important skills that many of the children will use as they get older.

Finally, we wanted to show you all these fantastic 'monster eyes' that the children made with Mr Caine in art – I'm sure you'll agree, we have some real artistic talent in Class 4! Have a great Easter break and we will see you back here for the Summer term!
