Early Years Foundation Stage (Nursery and Reception)

We have a thriving nursery class open to children aged 3 and above. With a maximum of 13 children per session, we maintain high standards and offer personalized learning experiences.

Located within our EYFS department, our nursery features free-flow access to a spacious outdoor area, providing ample opportunities for children to learn alongside Reception students.

In both Nursery and Reception classes, our focus is on creating secure and nurturing environments where children are encouraged to explore their curiosity, fostering confidence and independence in learning.

Thoughtfully chosen resources are available across all learning areas, supplemented by materials tailored to subjects and children's interests and needs.

Drawing on research on effective learning, we integrate Outdoor Learning and Forest School principals into our timetable to offer diverse experiences that support overall development, including in maths, literacy, and physical skills.

We prioritise building strong relationships with parents, engaging them through discussions about their children's interests and offering opportunities for involvement through events like 'Stay and Play' sessions and workshops on Phonics and Maths Mastery.

Leveraging our wooded setting and small class sizes, we strive to provide each child with a personalised learning journey, ensuring they receive the best possible start to their educational path.

KS1 and KS2 Curriculum



The National Curriculum follows on from the EYFS Curriculum and embraces a wide range of subjects.

Core Subjects:

English; Mathematics; Science; and Computing.

Foundation Subjects:

Religious Education; History; Geography; Art; Music; Design and Technology; Physical Education; and Personal, Social, Health & Citizenship Education.

Our Curriculum

We have developed an ambitious, engaging curriculum that is tailored to meet the individual needs of all our children.

Encompassing characteristics of effective learning, children are encouraged to adopt their own learning style and positive attitudes towards their learning. This in turn, develops the resilience and perseverance needed, to become lifelong learners.

Benefits of Mixed Year Groups

Mixed year groups in primary schools offer several benefits.

Firstly, they foster a sense of community and cooperation among pupils, as younger children learn from older peers, and older pupils develop leadership skills by mentoring younger ones.

Additionally, mixed year groups allow teachers to tailor learning experiences to individual needs, as pupils progress at their own pace rather than being restricted by age-based expectations. This setup promotes flexibility and personalised support, ensuring that each child receives appropriate challenges and assistance.

Furthermore, mixed year groups encourage social interaction across different age groups, promoting empathy, tolerance, and a broader understanding of diversity.

Overall, mixed year groups promote a more inclusive and dynamic learning environment that prepares pupils for the complexities of the real world.

Forest School

Our Forest School is run by a qualified Forest School practitioner who continuously maintains and develops their professional practice. The forest school concept originated in Scandinavia and enables children to develop their confidence, self-esteem, independence & social skills during child led and curriculum linked activities in our own on site woodland setting.

All key stages have weekly sessions and the children are actively involved in developing & maintaining our site plus contributing to the planning of their sessions. Activities include: story telling & singing, using senses to explore, campfire cooking, den building, wild arts/crafts, wood crafts, site conservation & tool use (pen knife, bow saw & bill hook). These are just some of the experiences' children will enjoy!

Principles of Forest School

- Forest School is a long-term process of frequent and regular sessions in a woodland or natural environment, rather than a one-off visit. Planning, adaptation, observations and reviewing are integral elements of Forest School.
- Forest School takes place in a woodland or natural wooded environment to support the development of a relationship between the learner and the natural world.
- Forest School aims to promote the holistic development of all those involved, fostering resilient, confident, independent and creative learners
- Forest School offers learners the opportunity to take supported risks appropriate to the environment and to themselves. (FSA)



In January 2020, we were awarded the Gold award by the Woodland Trust. This was achieved through collaboration between children, staff, parents and the wider community.

To promote the benefits of Forest School and to create community, links we hold termly community sessions for preschool age children and their carers.



Extra Curriculum activities







The school extends pupils' experiences beyond the small community where they live through precisely planned visits and a programme of visitors.

Extra-curricular activities are positive experiences that contribute to the wellbeing and happiness of children.

Peripatetic lessons are available to all children. Guitar, piano and clarinet have proved popular.

Lunch time and afterschool clubs take place daily and pupils are involved in choosing the types of clubs they want

Examples would be Archery and Table Tennis (both of which have been chosen by our KS2 pupils), as well as construction and art, chosen by our KS1 pupils.

We hold school trips throughout the year and have visiting workshops. Because of our small class sizes, we are able to explore our local community! There is also an annual residential for Class 4 (years 5 and 6).

Wraparound Care

At Cadmore End School, we are pleased to offer high-quality wraparound care to support our families with flexible and affordable childcare options.

Staffing

All sessions are fully supervised by a **qualified teacher** and a **Learning Support Assistant (LSA)**, ensuring a safe and nurturing environment for your child.

The area

Cadmore End C of E Combined School and Nursery is situated within woodland surroundings, a couple of miles south west of High Wycombe. The school is in easy reach from Stokenchurch, Frieth, Lane End, West Wycombe, Booker and Marlow. 3-5 miles either way from Cadmore End C of E Primary School will take you to junction 4 or 5 of the M40.

The nearest main line railway station is High Wycombe which has a regular service to Marylebone Station. The approximate travelling time is 45 minutes.

Admissions

The introduction of parents, carers and children to the school is extremely important. Prospective parents and carers, are invited to email or telephone the school, to make an appointment to attend an open day or have a personal tour, whilst discussing admission arrangements.

Pupils in Reception, KS1 or KS2

The Buckinghamshire "Guide for Parents" is available from the school office and on the Buckinghamshire web site. To apply for a reception place, you will need to apply through Buckinghamshire Council. For mid-year applications, please contact the school office. office@cadmoreendschool.org

The County Council are responsible for all placements for children entering Reception year. The school is responsible for all nursery and mid-year admissions.

Pupils are admitted in the September if they become 5 between September and the following August. The school admission number is 15 per year. All pupils start in the September. Arrangements are made for the pupils entering the Reception class to spend some time in the school prior to their entry.
