Maths, Phonics and Reading Parent Workshops

Last year, we adopted Maths Mastery and Twinkl Phonics and, through DFE funding and external support, we have really hit the ground running. This year, we are focusing on embedding the teaching and learning of Maths Mastery, phonics and reading across the school.

On Thursday 5th October at 2.15pm, we have a Parent Phonics Workshop and encourage parents of children in EYFS – Year 3 to attend.



The workshop will help you understand how and why phonics and reading is taught and how best to support your child or children at home.



On Friday 6th October at 2.30pm, we have a Maths Mastery Workshop for Class 1 and 2 parents and on Friday 13th October at 2.30pm, we have a Maths Mastery Workshop for Class 3 and 4 parents. These sessions will introduce you to Maths Mastery, how it

is delivered, resources used and how best to support your child or children at home.



Homework and Reading

All children in years 1-6 will have received homework. The purpose of homework is for children to practice and consolidate skills and learning that have been taught. It also helps to foster good habits of independence, organisation and self-discipline in preparation for the demands of secondary/grammar School.

I cannot stress how important daily reading is and to encourage you to listen to your child read a minimum of three times a week. When pupils become fluent readers, it is very important to focus on comprehension. Reading regularly also helps pupils in other curriculum subjects — especially English.


