School Funding Challenges:

While we have a lot to celebrate, there are challenges that lie ahead, particularly regarding funding for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), which impacts a small number of our pupils. As you may be aware, in September 2024, the local authority made the decision not to renew the High Needs Block Funding (HNBF) support they provide to all schools across the county.

HNBF is funding specifically allocated to support children with more complex needs who require additional assistance beyond what schools are expected to provide through the typical mainstream funding. This includes funding towards additional teaching assistants who work with pupils individually or in smaller groups, and other learning aids to ensure that every child has access to the education they need, regardless of their individual challenges.

We understand that this news may be worrying for parents of children who are in receipt of this support, so I want to reassure you that despite the withdrawal of this funding, there will be no reduction in the support provided to any pupils at Cadmore End. The school and governing board have made a joint commitment to maintain the current level of SEND provision throughout the academic year, and to ensure we can do this, we have decided to temporarily run a small budget deficit while working on longer-term solutions. This decision will reduce our reserves, but will not take us into debt or affect the financial stability of the school.

Our longer-term strategy includes formally advocating for HNBF reinstatement with local authority officials and actively pursuing additional funding through Education, Health, and Care Plans (EHCPs). Although EHCPs require more time and extensive evidence to obtain, Mrs Groom, our Headteacher and SENCO, has a proven track record of successfully securing this funding for our pupils. Despite a backlog of applications with the local authority from schools across the county, we are confident we will achieve the necessary EHCP funding to return to a balanced budget in the next academic year.

For parents whose children are not in receipt of additional funding through HNBF, we want to assure you that these financial challenges will not affect the quality of education your children receive. Our priority is to maintain a well-resourced and inclusive school environment for all pupils, as we believe that when every child thrives, the entire school community benefits.

We will keep you regularly updated on developments, and I encourage you to reach out via Office@CadmoreEndSchool.org if you have any specific questions of concerns.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Following my communications to you last academic year, I would like once again focus on the ongoing issue of punctuality. Arriving on time each day is vital, not only for your child's learning but also for the smooth running of the school day and avoiding disrupting the learning of others.

Punctuality helps children develop good habits that will benefit them both academically and personally, fostering a sense of responsibility and readiness. I encourage you to ensure your children are in school on time each morning, as part of our shared commitment to their success.

Reminder: The school gates open at 08:35 and registration takes place at 08:45

Wrap-around Care:

We recognise that the timings of the school day can present challenges for some, which is why I am pleased to remind you that new for the 2024-25 academic year, the school now offers a full wrap-around care service from 07:45 to 18:30. Full details can be found on the school website.
