Did you know, that research has found that young children whose parents read to them daily, have been exposed to at least 290,000 more words by the time they enter school, than kids who aren't read to regularly? News From The Classrooms

Class 1

Class 1 have been busy learning about Kings and Queens!

The children began by learning about King Charles III and his role as king. They then thought about what they would do if they were king or queen for the day and how they would help the nation. The children also had fun painting portraits of King Charles!

The class then learnt about some of the castles where the King may stay in the UK and found where these castles are in the country using google maps.





The children have enjoyed playing with the small world castle in the classroom and learnt some new vocabulary, 'arrow slit, moat and turret' when exploring the features of castles. The class then pretended to be in their own castle in the outside area and use the pallets as pretend arrow slits to fire the bow and arrow across the garden!

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Class 2

Class 2 have been busy growing bean plants as part of our Plants Science unit. The children have kept a diary and recorded the growth of their bean each week. I look forward to finding out how big they grow when the children take them home.

In English, we have been looking at the book 'The King Who Banned the Dark.' and in History, we have found out about Kings and Queens. We thought it would be nice to send our King a 'Get Well' card.

Class 3

This term, Class 3's topic has been 'Crime and Punishment'. We have looked at how the British justice

system has developed over the past thousand years. From the crucifixions of the Ancient Romans to the establishment of the Police Force under Sir Robert Peel, we have looked at how and where crimes and punishments came from.

In English, the children have enjoyed reading poetry by Michael Rosen. We have used these as inspiration to write our own free verse and rhyming poetry, exploring feelings and emotions.

In maths, we have been learning about fractions and their links to decimals. The Year 3s have also been learning about mass and how it is measured.

In science, we have been experimenting with forces and magnets. We have sorted magnetic and nonmagnetic materials, investigated the strength of magnets and seen how magnets are using in everyday life.

In computing, we have been looking at using Microsoft PowerPoint to create branching stories with various different endings.

As an end to the term, Class 3 have put on an Easter Egg competition to celebrate this very important time of year! Enjoy your Easter break. Class 3 Team.

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Class 4

In English, the children have been really captivated by the incredible story of Ernest Shackleton and his expedition to Antarctica in 'The Endurance'. They have learnt all about the geography of Antartica and the story has afforded the children opportunities to write across many genres including diary, letter and report writing. As I write, we are just approaching the end of the story and the children are very excited to find out whether all the crew returned home safely!

There has been a real push on times tables in maths this term and creating a little healthy competition in class seems to motivated all the children to secure them. We started the term immersed in the world

of fractions, decimals and percentages and are now exploring area & perimeter of different shapes.

In our study of the Chang Dynasty, we have been using a cross curricular link to computing to support our learning, the children have enjoyed researching and creating power points to explore this fascinating part of history.

Finally, as you can see below, we have some very talented artists in class 4. With guidance from Mrs Kane, the children have been studying the work of Claude Monet



and have recreated some of his famous work in their own unique styles! Have a lovely Easter break! Mr Stone & Mrs Cane
