News From The Classrooms!

News from Class 1

Class 1 have settled in so well over the last few weeks and we have been really enjoying our topic of 'All About Me'. We have learnt about our feelings through the story, 'The Colour Monster' and Reception has practised listening for initial sounds when labelling the different emotions. We learnt about our houses and homes focusing on the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. We made our own houses out of junk modelling and discussed whether they were strong enough to keep the wolf out! We have also learnt about our bodies and the importance of brushing our teeth and washing our hands.

In maths, Nursery has been working on 2D shapes and Reception has been practising sorting, as well as learning to subitise numbers (recognise how many objects are in front of them without counting). We have also been on a walk to the local woods to look for signs of Autumn and to collect leaves and other Autumnal treasures to look at in class. Mrs Deane

English

Our book in English 'Rain before Rainbows' is a beautiful book with stunning illustrations. This inspired our poetry writing and illustrations. We have also written poems about our favourite colours and our senses.

Science

In Science, we found out about everyday material and investigated what would be the best material to keep Teddy dry in the rain.





We tested different materials and we all agreed plastic material would be the best because it is waterproof.

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Art

We have had lots of fun in Art learning about primary and secondary colours, warm and cold colours and tints. We have used the styles of Jackson Pollack, Kandinsky, Mondrian and Rothko.

Class 3


Class 3 are so excited to be back! In our English we are still looking at Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx but now the class have been working on writing narratives! We have tried using expanded noun phrases, direct speech, similes, conjunctions, and adverbials. The children have worked so hard and have published some fantastic, neat stories.

In Maths we have moved onto addition and subtraction working on hundreds, tens and ones. As well as using column addition and subtraction, we are working hard on how to exchange when we need to cross 1s, 10s or 100s. The Year 4s have even been working on 1000s! We have even been using place value counters to support us!

In Science we have been looking at States of Matter and how things can change between Solids, Liquids and Gases. We have done experiments with lemonade and even with chocolate which the class loved.









Class 4

This term, as part of our unit on Scientists and Inventors, Class 4 have been learning about biographies in English. We started by learning all about the contributions of famous inventors and scientists, such as Steve Jobs, Steven Hawkings and Mary Leaky. We then looked at the biographies of other famous people to understand how to write the best biographies. We ended our unit by using what we had learnt to write biographies about ourselves which are now on display in our classroom!
