HOMEWORK



Maths and English homework will be set

on Thursdays and it is to be handed in on Wednesday morning. The work will be differentiated and will usually be based around that weeks learning objective or topic. As guidance, your child should not spend more than 20 minutes on an activity. The children should also be reading **at least 3** times a week - this will be monitored closely on a daily basis.

SNACKS AND DRINKS

Children can bring a snack for break time, please make sure it is a healthy one but please remember that we are a nut free school. Children will also need a named water bottle to keep in class.

MATHS

We will continue to follow the Whiterose scheme of learning for maths . For the first few weeks, the children will be further developing their understanding of number, looking at place value, numbers up to 10,000,000, negative numbers and rounding. We will then move onto the four operations of mathematics and finish the term exploring fractions. In conjunction with this, we will continue to learn with fluency and practice our times tables.

LITERACY

We start the term with a study of the Michelle Majorian book 'Goodnight Mister Tom'. This novel links really well with our WW2 history topic and tells the story of a young evacuee during this period. As writers, the children will be using the text to write diary entries, letters home, descriptive writing and poetry. As readers, we will explore inference and deduction, vocabulary and spelling. The children will also be taught specific grammatical concepts that will be embedded into their weekly writing sessions.

SCIENCE

We start the term looking at 'Properties and Changes of Materials' The children will investigate a number of different materials and develop their understanding of how to separate a mixture, why some substances dissolve and irreversible changes. In the second half term, the children will learn about forces!

HISTORY and ART

In history, the children will be studying some of the events of WWII and what it was like for children during this period. We will learn about evacuation, rationing, Anderson shelters, how the war started and how it finally came to an end. In art/DT the children will create a variety of art/DT work inspired by WWII including creating models of Anderson shelters.
